Jim and Melana Davison are AOS Accredited Judges. They have an extensive and diverse orchid collection that seems to be continuously growing. Not only involved in caring for their orchids, they are actively involved in several South Florida orchid societies. Melana is the current President of the Orchid Society of



Coral Gables and past President of the South Dade Amateur Orchid Club. Jim is the past President of the Orchid Society of Coral Gables and the East Everglades Orchid Society.

Jim's appreciation for orchids stems from his scientific background. Until his recent retirement, he worked as a Nuclear Chemistry Manager at the Turkey Point Nuclear Power Plant. Melana is more interested in the aesthetic qualities of orchids, especially the ones that look strange and other worldly. She owns her own Orchid Maintenance business and is known as "The Orchidiva." Now that Jim is retired, their plans for their own retail nursery are full steam ahead. They have opened Jim-N-I Orchids, and are currently building a new greenhouse and revamping their shadehouse. How to prepare your orchids for a hurricane! By Milton O. Carpenter

- 1, If your collection is small and mobile then certainly bring all into the home and place away from windows.
- 2, If some of your plants are growing on trees you might want to tie a small piece of shade cloth around the plant (and tree-trunk) so that (a) the plant is less likely to be "gone with the wind" and (b) if all the leaves are blown off the tree the plant is less likely to suffer sunburn from the increased light (no do not put sunscreen on the leaves as a rule).
- 3. If you cannot bring all the plants into the house, take them all off benches and put them on the ground where they are less likely to be blown over. Be careful to keep them above any flood water.
- 4. If plants are still in your shade house (or greenhouse) and some of the shade cloth has been blown away, replace it immediately. It only takes a few hours to really sunburn the leaves and this damage does not generally go away.
- 5. If plants have been blown over and are starting to come out of the pots, check the roots as this may be a good time to re-pot. Generally, most orchids respond to re-potting immediately after they have finished blooming.
- 6. It is a good rule to have enough spare shade cloth on hand (kept in your home or elsewhere) to replace all shade cloth the orchids are currently under.
- 7. Because your plants left in the storm will be wet for some time have plenty of fungicides Captan, etc. on hand to apply as soon as the rain is over. You can even use ordinary kitchen cinnamon in a pinch. Then try to let the plants dry out well before watering again.
- 8. Don't leave orchids in bloom outside if possible - the blooms will probably be ruined and the wind resistance can cause the plant to fall over. Consider cutting the flowers and put them in the house.
- 9. If plants are left outside, remember the possibility of the tags becoming lost. Tie name tags to the plant itself so the name and other info will be retained.
- 10.If plants are left outside, do everything possible to protect the leaves from wind-blown bruises, sunburn, etc. Remember the leaves are the "food factory" for the plant, converting sunlight into sugars for the plants to live.



Hurricane advice and Sale Postponed to Sept 7, 2019

Friends,

Hurricane Dorian is a dangerous and unpredictable storm. Although we initially believed that the track had us in the clear, the most recent advisories have moved its track southward. So, while our thoughts remain mostly with our friends up the coast, Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties cannot rule out a direct hit. Therefore we are postponing our sale this Saturday until the next Saturday, September 7, 2019. And, we are reproducing our hurricane preparation advice.



When a hurricane is looming one should run all the orchids as dry as possible to reduce the threat of fungus and bacteria. But contra-intuitively, just before the storm strikes one should saturate the orchids to the max. You should do this five to twelve hours before landfall, depending on your schedule.

First, because we want the plants to be as heavy as possible to help prevent them being blown away or about. Second, because if one's water source is a well, electricity for the pump may be off for days or even weeks. Thoroughly watered plants will be much happier should this occur. Even if you are able to bring all your collection inside, water them thoroughly with two to three applications spaced a few minutes apart. They will be perfectly happy for a day or two without water and we will all have enough mess to deal with without watering orchids in the house.

Remember, wind velocity increases *exponentially* as height increases. Get your plants as close to the ground as possible but off the ground as flooding may saturate them with fungus and bacteria. Usually it is not wise to attempt to cover them with a tarp or shade cloth as the whipping of the cloth by the wind likely will cause more harm than the wind itself.

If you are growing under shade cloth, the cloth should be furled tightly to protect it. Bright burning sun is typical in the wake of a hurricane and shade will be invaluable If you are growing under trees be prepared for the possibility that the protective canopy will be destroyed. Have a plan to protect your plants from sun burn.

Good luck and please feel free to share this information with whomever may benefit from it.
